Hello Doug!

One aspect of faith is the manifestation of our belief in God (Father, Son and Holy Ghost). Say for example, a person told you that there was \$1BILLION dollars worth of gold in your back yard. There is only one catch, the gold is deep underground, and in other words, you have to work to get at it. My actions thereafter, judge whether I have faith in the words the man has told me. If I say I believe him and I do nothing, then my very actions contradict my words. Not even the laziest of saps would simply fold his arms and let the thought of what the gold must look like torment his imagination and dreams. If, when I hear these words, I begin to dig and work in my back yard then the man who has told me does not even have to ask me if I believe him. My actions give substance to my belief. In the same way, we need to do some sort of good works to give substance to our faith in Jesus Christ.

Mr. Ravenhill gave a better illustration, if I read all the exercise and fitness books in the world, and study muscles physiology to the extent that I may become a respected authority for the knowledge of muscle function, no knowledge I possess will add a single gram of muscle to my body. Unless I exercise my knowledge and beliefs, my muscles will not miraculously grow. In the same way unless our faith is exercised, it will never grow.

In short, as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead (James 2:26)

I just noticed this in Robert Barclay's CATECHISM (he was a quaker):

Question. What is Faith?

A. Faith is the Substance of things hoped for and the Evidence of things not seen .

Q. Is Faith of absolute Necessity?

A. Without Faith it is impossible to please him; for he that cometh to God, must believe that he is, and that he is a Rewarder of them that diligently seek him .

Q. Are we justified by Faith?

A. Wherefore the Law was our School-master to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by Faith .

Q. What is the Nature of this Faith that availeth to Justification?

A. For in Jesus Christ neither Circumcision availeth any thing, nor Uncircumcision; but Faith which worketh by Love .

Q. Are Works then necessary to Justification as well as Faith?

A. But wilt thou know, O Vain Man, that Faith without Works is Dead? Was not Abraham our Father justified by Works when he had offered Isaac his Son upon the Altar? Seest thou how Faith wrought with his Works, and by Works was Faith made perfect? And the Scripture was fulfilled; which saith, Abraham believed God, and it was imputed to him for Righteousness: He was called the Friend of God. Ye see then how that by Works a man is justified, and not by Faith only .
