We have to maintain ourselves in the place of beholding, "..."

From Brother Ravenhill: "I can think of one thing when I get to the Judgment Bar and Jesus will look down and say, 'I had many things to tell you but you couldn't bear them.' We're too busy running our own lives: praying when you want to pray, eating what you want to eat, going where you want to go, spending what you want to spend, reading what you want to read, (Do you) call that a spiritual life? Brother, it is carnal as carnality

From my study this past week of John 11 and prayer for revival: Reading John 11 slowly, we can sometimes see Lazarus (deadly sick, even dead as we see death) and Martha seeking Him on behalf of her brother with what faith she had.
