We take a verse here and a verse there and w e base our whole doctrinal position on those verses and yet very few of us have studied to show ourselves approved, rig htly dividing the word of truth.

Pilate asked Jesus, "What is truth?".

Jesus said, "I am the way the truth and the life".

If Jesus is the WAY and He is the Life, then we can also state firmly that He is the Truth.

We define truth by throwing together words from printed matter, the bible and we conclude that that is the truth, that that is the word of God. But the Word became flesh and it says, "Grace and Truth came by Jesus Christ".

We come back to Pilates question, "What is Truth?".

I have often pondered that question. Sometimes I can almost grasp it like a carrot before the horse. It's not easily display ed like a work of art.

What is truth? The answer is Jesus Christ.

So how do we put Jesus Christ into words to create a doctrine so that He can be taught?

Acts 13:10 And said, O full of all subtilty and all mischief, thou child of the devil, thou enemy of all righteousness, wilt tho u not cease to pervert the right ways of the Lord?

To me all of our theological understandings in the larger sense or our one or two pet doctrines we hold onto are the major part of why we divide. If we could just start to agree on what is more fundamental and important then we would realize how much fellowship and unity there is in the body of Christ.

Also I even see in many theological positions though they seem to contradict each other they arrive exactly at the same destination or point. Jesus Christ is the end goal of any true theology. "Since Satan comes as a serpent in the persons of false teachers, and by them labours to put a cheat on us and cozen us with error for truth; to defend us against this design, it is necessary that we be girt with truth in our understanding—that we have an estabÂ-lished judgment in the truths of Christ..."

Why do we need an established judgment? One reason is because there are...

"those who labour to unsettle the judgements of others—to ungird this belt about the Christian loins. They come with the devilÂ's question in their mouths, Â'Yea, hath God said?Â' are you sure this is a truth? do not your ministers deceive you? labouring slyly to breed suspicions and jealÂ-ousies in the hearts of Christians towards the truths they have received..."

"Question. But some may say, How is it possible that ordinary professors should attain to this estabÂ-lished judgement in the truth, when we see many of great parts and eminency much unsettled in their judgments?

Answer First. We must distinguish between perÂ-sons. Of persons, there are many eminent for parts, whose parts want piety to establish them, and no wonder to see wanton wits unfixed in the truths of God. None sooner topple over into err or than such as have not an honest heart to a nimble head. The richest soil without culture is most tainted with such we eds. They have been men of unsanctified parts that have been the leaders in the way of error, though the more simple and weak that are led by them. They are knowing men, which first disgorge and vomit error from their from their corrupt hearts, and ignorant ones that lick it up. And therefore despair not of an established judgement, so long as thou desirest to have an honest upright heart, and conscientiously usest the means. The promise is on thy side: Â'The fear of the Lor d is the beginning of wisdom,Â' and Â'a good understanding have they that do his commandÂ-ments,Â' Ps. 111:10.

Answer Second. We must distinguish between truths. Some are fundamental, others are superstrucÂ-tory. Now, though many eminent for piety as well as parts, are in the dark concerning some of the superÂ-structory and more circumstant ial—because mysterÂ-iously laid down in the word—yet there is a sweet harmony among the godly in fundamentals; and in those, poor souls, thou mayest come by a faithful use of means to be established. As for our bodies, God hath so provided, that things necessary to preserve their life are more common, and to be had at a cheapÂ-er rate, than things for delicacy and state. So also for our souls. If bread were as hard to come by as sweetmeats, or if water were as scarce as wine, the greatest part of men must needs famish. So if truths necessary to salvation were as hard to be understood and cleared from the Scriptures as some others, many poor weak-parted Christians would certainly perish without a mi racle to help them. But the saving truths of the gospel lie plain, and run clear to all, but those who roil the stream with their own corrupt minds."
