Hi Sree,

I will try to make my reply easier by breaking up your comment into segments and addressing each separately:

"So you agree with science that Homosexuality is genetic?"

Science is an important tool that God has given us to better understand Him and all that He has made. And although I don't agree with every conclusion made by different scientists, science itself is not contradictory to faith but rather strengthens and upholds it. It is our godless culture that has created a false dichotomy between faith and science which has unfortunately been working toward their favor, especially as many Christians have fallen victim to said lie and try to run the complete opposite direction, practically shunning knowledge. This is one of the many reasons why we as Christians are labelled as "ignorant" today. They have set the bait and we have taken it in the sense that they try to argue about genetic predisposition as a means to legitimize homosexuality and we get hung up on that instead of getting to the root, by making them understand that genetic predisposition doesn't matter because we are all predisposed to SIN and are called to turn from our carnal (natural) self toward Christ and live.

And as I mentioned, I believe that homosexuality can be a result of nature, nurture, or both in a variable degree from person to person, so to answer your question, I agree with science that people can have a genetic disposition to make them more likely to be led to a homosexual lifestyle than another person but I do not agree that this sets a precedence to say that homosexuality is acceptable which is a false conclusion made from the studies.

To answer this question, I will start with a question: if you know of a brother or sister who is struggling (the key word here) with alcohol, will you continually rebuke them every time they fall and just leave it at that or will you try to bear with them their burden and demonstrate patience and kindness and show in a clear way that you actually care about them as a person and want them desperately to be set free from their bondage and remind them of the grace we have through the gospel of Jesus Christ? I don't know about you, but I struggle with a lot of things myself, and there have been times when people around me showed me such grace and spoke truth (the gospel) into my life which has helped me to overcome different sins. Remember, at the end of the day, homosexuality is a sin just like the sins you and I commit on a daily basis. Also, it is scientifically proven that babies can be born with addiction to different substances if their mother happened to use those substances during pregnancy, which can also manifest itself later on in life after a period of dormancy. I will address the last part of your question of this section at the end of my reply.

How can you be so certain that homosexuality cannot have a genetic component to it? Do you have biblical evidence to support this claim? We actually see a greater precedence for a genetic basis of sin in general from the fall of man and the idea of sin dwelling in our flesh. As far as I know, every single human being is predisposed to sin and sinfulness is not something that is taught, it is just something that we are. Even King David says "I was sinful from birth." But an important point to make here is that we are not born committing every single sin there is known to man or will every single person commit every single sin there is to commit in their lifetime. Where am I going with this statement? To point out that every person struggles with different sins, even from their childhood, some being more prone to anger and rebellion to their parents than others, some more prone to steal and hurt other kids, while some are more mild and gentle. To me, it doesn't take much of a logical jump from here to say that some kids can also be more prone to homosexuality than others based on the reasoning stated above.

Once again, I am not sure how you are coming to make such a strong distinction between homosexuality and all other sins. Are not all sins lies at the core?

Let me use an example utilizing the logic that you presented here (or at least what I understand from what you have written above, which wasn't all too clear to me): A boy struggles with lust and is "inflamed with passion" for girls, not just one, but almost every pretty girl he sees, it is his nature to do so. Now, is he unsaved because he has these super strong desires that he struggles with, as in he knows the thoughts are not pleasing to the Lord and he also desires to be free from them? Or let me use another example: I heard that married men to varying degrees struggle with unfaithful thoughts and desires and even moments where they have a sexual image in their mind that is not of their wife and that this is something that they struggle with for a long time. Are these men not saved because they struggle with such thoughts?

God sometimes seems to quickly bring deliverance from certain sins while allowing us to struggle with others while another person might have the very opposite happen where what you struggle with was more easily overcome by the other person while they struggle with something you easily overcame. Just as I know that I will probably struggle with lust for a long time but have no temptation toward homosexuality, I don't find it hard to believe that another person might not have much difficulty in regard to lust but have a great deal of difficulty in regards to homosexuality.

So at the end of the day, the point is not about arguing with the secular world if people can be born a homosexual or not and appearing ignorant by so easily brushing off any sort of scientific data saying "I don't believe in science", but getting to the more relevant argument that we are ALL born sinners and that gossip and slander and lust and rebellion against parents is just as much a damnable sin as homosexuality. That is wonderful and I am sure that you are using such a blessing and gift to advance the kingdom of God! We definitely have a great need for faithful believers in science and academics to bring the light of Christ to the so called "intellectuals"! I am also in the field of science myself, just got my PhD in Cellular & Molecular Pathology from UCLA 3 months ago :)

Now to this man I do not believe God will put a gene in him that will prevent him to use this distinctive male organs of him (created to unite with a female) to be used to unite with a male. If so then it is clear waste of resource. It is clearly against creationists arguments of intelligent design where we say that every living thing is intelligently designed by a creator."

I feel a bit of clarification will help with this one. Scientists are not trying to look for a homosexual gene per se, but try to identify genetic factors that can contribute to homosexuality. They are not trying to look for some gene that homosexuals have that heterosexuals do not, as it would be more of a pleiotropic effect, in that multiple genes would most likely be involved. These multiple genes would be present in all human beings, but somewhat mutated or altered in function compared to other people. So why do I bring this up? Because the idea that you presented of "God putting a homosexual gene into a person" is an irrelevant point if the effect (homosexuality) was caused by normal genes we all have being effected and altered in their function by mutations or epigenetic changes (a very interesting topic of research that you might want to look into - kind of explains Exodus when God says that He will visit the sins of the fathers to the 3rd and 4th generations - I can also explain more on the forum if people are interested). Now, as it is absolutely clear that a myriad of genetic and epigenetic aberrations are known to cause all sorts of malformations and disease (clearly due to the fact that we are living in a fallen world), it is not much of a logical jump to say that homosexuality or rather a stronger tendency towards it can be attributed in like fashion to different genetic and epigenetic aberrations.

Coming back to my argument from my previous reply; we are all born sinners (something that God did not intend or want but a clear and present reality), is it wrong for me to tell people that they shouldn't sin?

Also, what about people who are born as hermaphrodites; born with both male and female sex organs? How do you explain that? Clearly this individual is born with an ambiguous gender and this gender ambiguity clearly due to GENETIC and EPIGENETIC aberrations.

Once again, it is the media that oversimplifies things. Scientists are not looking for some "new gene" that normal people don't have but are looking for genes that we all have which are not working properly that contributes to homosexuality in certain but not individuals.

The fallen Adamic nature encompasses all of our being: the flesh, the soul, the spirit. Sin and death (or dying) is not only a matter of the mind, but a matter of the spirit, as well as the flesh (our physical body made up of trillions of cells that each have thousands of genes). Kids don't lie because they are taught, they do it because they are fallen, sinful people from birth with a corrupted body, soul, and spirit.

As I mentioned before, it has been shown that mothers who use drugs and alcohol can pass the addiction onto their unborn fetus (epigenetics). In this same logic, it is very reasonable to think that this is also possible with homosexuality, not that if the mother is homosexual that it will be passed on but that things can happen physiologically to the mother whether through life decisions, health, etc. that can alter the hormones, etc. of the fetus in such a way that predisposes them to homosexuality.

I am a male, therefore I have testosterone raging through my body. Testosterone is the primary hormone that makes me a male and is a big factor that contributes to my desire for women. God intended this to be something good, but it is my fallen nature that turns this good thing into sin through lust, etc. Although I am not born lustful per se, I am predisposed to lust because I am a healthy, testosterone pumping male.

Where I am on this to date is as follows.

I do think that it's likely that certain people have a propensity toward homosexuality from birth, but I don't accept that it is God who has made them so.

And so as a result (and it is frightening) God has lifted restraint in our day and, in a very massive way, given men over to this. And because of the general weakness of the church (I am generalizing) and its inability to resist this onslaught, the tsunami has engulfed even many of the homes of the righteous.

I notice, by the way, that in the two places in the Old Testament where homosexuality was rampant, it was because of the apostate state of things, and the weak testimony of the righteous. One was in Sodom where Lot's testimony was very weak, and the other in the days of the Judges a passage of Scripture that is too horrific even to read. It is sandwiched between two statements that "in those days there was no king in Israel; every man did what was right in his own eyes." The same in our day. The churches are weak; apostasy is rampant.

So, what is the answer? A strong Testimony that puts a stop to apostasy. This is the answer, as Paul shows us in 1 Corinthians Ch. 6. He gives a list (it is not comprehensive) of those who will not inherit the kingdom of God. Homosexuals are on the list. Then he says this:

"And such WERE some of you. But ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the Name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God" (1 Cor. 6.11).

So, God has the answer! He has the provision to justify and cleanse. "The Name of the Lord Jesus, and the Spirit of our God." I am convinced that it is the general lack of this in the churches that, if not the cause, is the problem that leaves us deprived of the solution. God has The Answer to this immense flood of darkness... and I believe He has it for us...if we will get seeking! I know it's grown to huge proportion. But God is far, far greater, and has The Answer not only the Name of the Lord Jesus, but (underline this) the power of the Spirit of our God. Oh, how deeply we need to see this in our day! The cleansing power of the Spirit. We (I know I am generalizing again) have fallen so far from this. Never mind the homosexuals. It is WE who need to turn to the Lord! Oh to see the broken and the contrite heart in the churches, and a great cry to give the Spirit of the Lord His lordship in our midst! Oh to see a different kind of tsunami in our world! "O now I see the cleansing wave, the Fountain deep and wide; Jesus my Lord, might to save, points to His wounded side..."

He still has the same flesh that tempts him to have immoral sexual relationship, but Spirit empowers him to overcome. There is no change in his Physical make up what so ever. Even in the case where God miraculously takes away certain sins like addiction, it is only a spiritual healing not a Physical change, Physically the man is still possible to fall back to addiction. Cross and switchblade refers to situation where people who receive Baptism of Holy Spirit and are miraculously healed from Drug addiction, fall back to it again. It is like Dog returning to its own vomit.

If we consider that Homosexual is genetic then it is not the temptation of flesh, it is something like a man born with mental disorder. To such a person you cannot make them accountable to God's law. The sins committed by a mentally unstable man is forgiven by default because he has no control of his mind. Same way someone who is born Homosexual has no control over their desire for men, we cannot ask them to change their sexual orientation. God himself does not ask man to stop using his sexual desires but use it in a marriage bed. But a Homosexually born man cannot get married either and how can he apply his sexual desires in a acceptable way?

Some Christians have homosexual kids and as a result support them in their ways and push for tolerance. It becomes very personal and therefore what parent doesn't fight for their kid? How hard is it for a parent to divide their love for their kid for the love of God and the justice of God in regards to homosexuality?

I see where all the posts addressed the question of homosexuality, the fact it is a family member was not addressed, I do not think.

But you raised an issue that has troubled many a sincere Believer: how does one deal with a child who chooses a life of perversion? The child was raised to abhor these things but now embraces them, how does a parent deal with it?

One can respond in one of two ways: justify it or stand your ground on the authority of the WORD.

There are many public figures and more private ones who find their child involved in perversion. Many of these children are finding support in their 'church' for their choices and are now very religious which in turn challenges our perception of sin. What they used to call sin they are now reconsidering their stance on the issue saying they were wrong because - you fill in the blanks, you have heard it all.

The pressure is strong to accommodate sin because parents are told they are old-fashioned, that nobody (important - spell that enlightened, educated) believes that anymore. They feel intimidated because they are. And they cave in.

(I have seen many preachers back off from firmly held beliefs because now their child is involved and they hate to see their child go to hell. Somehow they have missed it by believing they are the one who says who goes to heaven or hell.)

On the other hand you have parents who keep their eyes focused on the LORD Jesus knowing full well He is the authority of ALL of life, that He does not change and will not change to accommodate my child's willful sin. The LORD has provided one with the resources to combat sin and temptation and to willfully ignore them is a slap in God's face.

What is a parent's Biblical response? Our hope and faith is in the LORD Jesus. My child can never save me, neither can any well placed preacher, theologian; nor can I save my child. Nobody else but the LORD Jesus and we do well to stay rooted and grounded in Him. When one does this you pray and pray for your child. In the meantime you keep loving him. You do not expect his friends to accommodate his life choices but you are the parent and you keep loving him/her as your child. You need a divine infusion of love regularly to carry this off.
