2 Thessalonians 2

- 1 Now we beseech you, brethren, by the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, and by our gathering together unto him, note
- 2 That ye be not soon shaken in mind, or be troubled, neither by spirit, nor by word, nor by letter as from us, as that the day of Christ is at hand.
- 3 Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition;
- 4 Who opposeth and exalteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sitteth in the temple of God, shewing himself that he is God.
- 5 Remember ye not, that, when I was yet with you, I told you these things?

6 And now ye know what withholdeth that he might be revealed in his time. note

7 For the mystery of iniquity doth already work: only he who now letteth will let, until he be taken out of the way.

8 And then shall that Wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming:

9 Even him, whose coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders,

10 And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved.

11 And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie:

12 That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness.

In verse 4 it says the man of sits in the temple of God and in verse 8 it says that the antichrist is destroyed by Jesus return

It comes from the same stream of theology that taught for hundreds of years that the Jewish people would never ever never under any circumstances return to the land once known as Canaan.

Case in point:

"For so long a time has passed away since their exile, and since there has been no restoration of this people, it is certain that this prophecy ought not to be restricted to seed according to the flesh. For there was a prescribed time for the Jews, when the Lord purposed to restore them to their country; and, at the end of seventy years, a free return was granted them by Cyrus. Then Hosea spoke not here of the kingdom of Israel, but of the Church, which was to be restored by a return, composed of both Jews and of Gentiles." (John Calvin)

No restoration of this people? Not during Calvin'S time but what has happened since then?

"With regard to the prophetic expectations of Israel's restoration beyond the return from Babylon, "the expressions are not to be pressed literally because they are symbolical, not proper; typical, not literal; to be explained spiritually and not carnally. Israel is to be restored, not according to the flesh and letter, but according to the promise and spirit (Romans 9); the holy city, not Jerusalem, but the church."

"Certainly there will be a remarkable conversion of the Jews before the end of the world, "not that all will be converted, but that many will...(although we cannot be certain either in what way or when precisely it will take place)....But whatever that calling of them shall be, a restitution of the Jewish polity in the land of Canaan is not to be dreamed of....Besides, this polity was to last only until Christ....Finally, if God had wished to restore that polity, he would never have allowed it to b

abolished for so long a time (over sixteen centuries)."

Francis Turretin (1623-1687) studied at Calvin's Academy in Geneva and later taught there for 30 years.

A restoration of the Jewish polity in the holy land is not to be dreamed of? Well...uh...

Antichrist is not to be a real person? A return wasn't to be literal either.
