There are serious ramifications from these things, beyond the overt, there are subtleties that can become ingrained, that are very difficult to root out. A mindset that feels owed something, a certain 'clinging' to spurious imaginations, twisted promises taken from scripture, misunderstandings about healing, why we give... a multitude of things.
