Hi Greg,

I listened to Revival Hymn - very good - an inspiring collation.

Some comments for whoever put it together to think about:

1. Sometimes the voice recordings are not very easy to hear, and the music in the background is sometimes quite loud - this makes it difficult sometimes to hear what is being said. Is there a way to quieten down the background music so that the message of the speakers is more easily heard?

2. At one point there is a song being sung on its own, but i found the lyrics very difficult to understand - whoever was singing did not seem to be singing with a strong intention that the words would be easily understood by the hearers. In that case, what is the point of having the song? "Unless the trumpet sounds a CLEAR call, who will get ready for battle?" (1 Cori 4: 8) I think there's not much point putting in a message if no one can understand it ...

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But, on the whole, a very good collation and definitely worth listening to.
